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16-19 Study Programme

The Wolf Report – March 2011

- The DfE implemented all 27 of Professor Wolf's recommendations
- 16-19 Study Programme
 - Programme built for a young person (16-19)
 - Progression & future career aspirations
 - Substantial core qualification (main programme)
 - Include both *planned learning hours* and *planned employability, enrichment and pastoral hours*
 - English and/or mathematics (if not achieved A*- C)

Study programme funding update

- **New investment** in education to help young people catch up on lost learning - education recovery almost £5 billion
- How much of this is new money? - £1.6 billion provides “additional hours in the classroom for up to 100,000 T Levels students by 2024-25” and also funds “40 additional hours learning per student per year for 16- to 19-year-olds”
- £800 million (across 3 years) is being allocated to the additional 40 hours per student, as they ‘have the **least time left to recover learning lost**’
- Increase of 40 hours is **against** the hours entered for academic year **2020 - 2021**

Policy update

- 40 hours is equivalent of **one additional hour a week** in school or college
- National funding rate increase from £4,188 to £4,542 (**+£354 per student**) for students aged 16 and 17 and students aged 18+ with high needs
- **ESFA Guidance** - This time will be used **for extra teaching and learning** - including in English, maths and other subjects - **depending on students' individual needs**.
- Non-compliance will be addressed through the ESFA territorial teams:
 - Notify the relevant Regional Schools Commissioner (RSC) so they can take it into consideration as part of their wider oversight of those schools
 - Enforce policy by recovery of funding where hours are not increased, resulting in students falling into lower funding bands

National funding rate for students funded via the 16-19 funding formula for 2022/23

Band	Planned hours	Students	National funding rate per student
5	580+ hours	16 & 17 year olds, students aged 18 and over with high needs	£4,542
4a	485+ hours	Students aged 18 and over who are not high needs	£3,757
4b	485 – 579 hours	16 and 17 year olds, students aged 18 and over with high needs	£3,757
3	385 – 484 hours	all students	£3,056
2	300 - 384 hours	all students	£2,416
1	Up to 299 hours	all students	£4,542 proportion of Band 5

40 hours – what do we know?

- Record the qualification and non-qualification hours against each **student** on the census
- Delivery report for the **institution** (summer 2022) should be ‘ideally one page but no more than 2 pages in length’
